

Remote Learning Contingency Plan October 2020

Staff in school have now had training on the implementation of Google classroom and child log -on/user-names have been made available. Children in KS2 (Y3-6) have all been taught how to use google classroom while in school and homework will be set via this route initially, so that teachers, children and parents can be become familiar with the system

1. Plans for individual children self-isolating when the rest of the class is in school

Where possible the class teacher will post work that the class has done that day for the child to access at home. Work can then be completed and 'posted' back to the teacher for marking.

Year 1 children are now rapidly becoming familiar with and using google classroom

Year 2 children will shortly be introduced to Google classroom

Reception children will have work set via Tapestry

Parents may be also be directed to Oak academy website https://classroom.thenational.academy/ for work where this links directly to class teaching whilst the child is off.

Teachers will contact the child at home regularly over the two weeks to ensure they are able to access the work and to support with any issues. This may be via email or phone whichever is appropriate for the family circumstances.

Parents have been asked about home connectivity so that we can try to meet individual needs should a whole class need to self-isolate. It is hoped that Chrome books can be loaned to families where no laptop/tablet is available for the child to work on.

Each teacher has also produced a 'paper pack' of work focussing mainly on English and Maths that the child can access and complete at home -without the needing to access IT. Based on the reflection of the experiences in the summer term, this work will be consolidation work, rather than new learning so that misunderstandings do not create further difficulties. This will be sufficient for 10 days of work- reading, writing, arithmetic & spelling/grammar/phonics. There are also some theme based activities to further engage home learning, initially based on autumn/harvest. This is a backup should children be unable to access google classroom, in the short term, so that some school work would always be available. This work must come back into school to be marked so that any misconceptions can be addressed.

2. A whole class has to self- isolate as a result of a positive case in school

In the event that a class does have to self-isolate the class teacher will post work daily for the child to access at home. This will consist of a range of powerpoint presentations, links to youtube clips, texts and worksheets. Work can then be completed online and 'posted' back to the teacher for marking.

Reception children will have work set via Tapestry
