Google Forms Questionnaire

Thank you to everyone who completed the Google Forms questionnaire last week; we had 57 responses, which equates to 28%, which I am told is a high response rate for an online questionnaire.

The responses were unanimously positive in terms of the school's remote learning offer which was very heartening and reflects all the staff's hard work over the past eight weeks.

Summary:

- ◆ We had the greatest number of responses from Reception, Year 2 and Year3 parents
- ◆ Nearly everyone (84%) thought that the amount of work set was about right. 16% felt it was too much
- ◆ Nearly everyone (91%) thought that the work was set at the right level, with 7% saying it was too hard and 2% too easy
- ◆ On the whole, most children (over 80%) were willing to work at home, able to access the work, knew what was expected of them and received sufficient responses from school staff and coped well with the work set
- ◆ Some children struggled with work set (28%) and some showed some signs of anxiety (40%) which is understandable when trying to work at home
- ◆ Over 84% of parents felt they knew how to get support from school
- ◆ The three highest aspects of work that parents felt worked particularly well were the use of Google Classrooms, Tapestry, Live Lessons and feedback from school staff (all over 80%)

Looking Forward

- ◆ We have arranged for Premier, a sports coaching company, to deliver some gymnastic sessions in school for Year 2 and 3 starting on 18th March. There will also be a FREE gymnastic after school club funded by Woodside's sports premium grant from the government. It will run on a Thursday from 3.10–4.10pm. Look out for further information on how to book a place!
- ◆ The excitement of the Junior Book Awards is just around the corner; four new books for children in Year 5 and 6 to read, discuss and vote for their favourite. More information to follow!
- ◆ Next week, each child will receive a free seedling kit, courtesy of a parent. Plant them, watch them grow and possibly eat the results!
- ◆ In line with government guidance, there will be no swimming or school trips during the spring term. This will be reviewed after Easter.

Twice Weekly Rapid Flow Tests

Whole families and households with primary school, secondary school and college age children, including childcare and support bubbles, will be able to test themselves twice every week from home as schools return from 8 March.
